- x Eknoian (Oxford) statethat 80-85% of the monies the SG@suspending was directed toward personnel.
- x Nitschke invited the Committee members to the Technology 6 committee meeting convening Thursday evening, April 27, 2017 in Room 126. He added that 85-90% of all the money in schoolistricts is spent on personnel.

- x Huchting agreed with what was being suggested. She noted that it begged the question of howtheindividual SGCs were working. There may not be enough time or enough education/training when you have an SGC member in the beginning. It might take a half a year to figure out the right questions to applicate at SGCs and schools might be compalicated or different, but the education ingedby being on the committee helped

 - 1. Class Size Reduction and Support for Temphocument:
 - x Page 4 Classroom Support: There would be combination classes for Thousand OaksTO for grades K1 and 1-2. He noted that the language profiles there could accommodate this but it was not a solution to under-enrollment those classes The

There was an identity crisis with the salmod they needed to iron outdefinition, purpose and policy in the next 18-24 months. Bedolla asked how Independent Study/IS differed the continuation path. Scuderi stated that the kids in the IS program even sidered BHS students. That group of students technically we not students needing credit recovery needed an alternative steing or format and he noted a student could earn more credits in a semester at BTA than at BHS or IS heywere each serving two different goals. - x Beery clarified that the Bilingual Maintenance Program O(1 FTE) at \$102,399 would not be in the budget for 2017-18 since they had decided to go with the combo classes.
- x Eknoian asked if there was a way to earn partial credits toward graduation through alternatives like work equivalents. Scuderi said that happened in the pasthey did it less often now due thaving quality control issues around determining what kids were getting credit for.
- x Makler asked for clarification about the funds for Program Evaluation:
 - Was it a new program? No, in Measure A it was grouped with PD and Technology and shared 9% of thetNax RevenueThose were reorganized Measure E,1and Evaluation was moved to support high quality instruction under CSR along with ECO and Pas all are connected to teaching/teachers.
 - Where and how was it funded? Was it combined with other General Fund/GF moniesor essentially the analytics for the Dict? Beery responded that Evaluation was a large component of the analytics for the district. The BSEP fundingfor next year would be about the same amaistrainder Measure A, or approximately \$672K or 3.25% of revenues metimes additional funds because available to support Evaluation and PD functions, but BSEP datreebulk of that.
